

Elementary School Highlights


The Diocesan elementary school students consistently achieve standardized test scores that are **significantly higher** than national averages.





As a treasure within the diocese, our schools are a wise investment in the future of the Catholic Church.


Elementary School Revenue \$30,246,483




Elementary School Expenses \$26,899,951
